# 5. 2014 JOINT MEETING ON HAWAII WITH THE JAPANESE, R.G. Milner

In October 2014, we will hold the fourth joint meeting of the Division of Nuclear Physics of the American Physical Society with the nuclear physicists of the Physical Society of Japan (JPS). The previous meetings in 2001, 2005, and 2009 were outstanding successes.

Hawaii 2014 will be held at the Hilton Waikoloa Village on Hawaii's Big Island, 7-11 October, 2014. In addition to showcasing exciting nuclear physics, Hawaii 2014 is intended to foster cooperation, collaboration, and the exchange of ideas among the nuclear scientists from Japan, the U.S., and other Pacific Rim countries. It will provide an opportunity for students from Japan and the U.S. to meet and discuss their visions of careers in the field of nuclear physics.

#### **Hotel:**

The venue for this year's joint meeting, the Hilton Waikoloa, is the same as for the 2009 meeting and is located just 18 miles north of the Kona International Airport. Transportation is by 3 options: SpeediShuttle (~\$50 for one plus a \$2/person for additional people in a group), taxi (~\$70), and rental car (~\$100/day). Complete Conference Coordinators, Inc. has negotiated a very favorable rate for the meeting. The resort is located on a 62 acre parcel on the ocean, has ample meeting space, and a 4 acre lagoon for snorkeling and swimming with dolphins. It is near a shopping center (Queen's Market) with several restaurants, a food court, and a grocery store. The venue is near Mauna Kea and the Keck and Subaru Observatories.

## **Meeting Format:**

The meeting structure for Hawaii 2014 will resemble that of the previous joint meetings. Workshops will be held on Tuesday October 7<sup>th</sup>, preceding the plenary and scientific sessions that follow on October 8-11th. The plenary session on Wednesday morning will open the main meeting and will highlight nuclear physics in Japan and the U.S. The following scientific sessions will be held during the morning and evening, except on the last day of the meeting (Saturday) when sessions will be scheduled in the morning and afternoon. There will be an Hawaiian Luau on Friday evening to celebrate the joint meeting.

Typically, a morning or evening session will see one invited speaker session taking place in parallel with multiple sessions of contributed papers and mini-symposia. As is usual, mini-symposia will involve one lead (invited) talk followed by contributed papers all focused on the same topic. The mini-symposia are viewed as ideal sessions to integrate the JPS and DNP communities around topics of mutual interest. Contributed talk slots will again be 15 minutes, time for a 12 minute presentation with three minutes allotted for questions and discussion. Lead talks in mini-symposia will be 30 minutes (25+5) in length. Invited session talks slots will be 45 minutes (35+10) in length.

#### Luau Tickets

There will be a luau on Friday evening at 6:00 p.m. Advanced tickets for adults (13 - 99 years old) will be \$90. On-site tickets will cost \$100. Tickets for children (5-12) will be half price. Kids 4 and under will not be charged.

## 6. CEU14, Warren Rogers

The 12th annual Conference Experience for Undergraduates (CEU), will be held in conjunction with the Hawaii 2014 Joint Meeting. More than 100 undergraduate students, who have participated in nuclear physics research during the past year, will participate in CEU14. The program will include several special events for the undergraduates, including a research poster session to which all DNP conference participants are invited, three nuclear physics seminars, an ice cream social, and a graduate school information session at which university and laboratory representatives will be present to share with the students about graduate school opportunities. (The application deadline for the CEU was 1 August 2013.) The CEU is generously supported by the National Science Foundation, the Department of Energy (through the national labs), and the Division of Nuclear Physics.

## 7. NSAC LONG-RANGE PLAN 2015

At the Nuclear Science Advisory Committee (NSAC) meeting on April 24-25, 2014 in Bethesda, MD, NSAC was charged from the DOE Office of Science and the Mathematical and Physical Sciences Division of the NSF requesting the development of a Long Range Plan for nuclear physics. The white papers from all areas of nuclear physics are

due by December (2014) with a resolution meeting to take place sometime in Jan/Feb/Mar 2015. Recommendations are desired by DOE by March 2015; the report is due in October 2015.

The DNP Executive Committee has the responsibility for organizing and running the various town meetings. Plans for four town meetings have been disseminated via email to the DNP membership. **Please see the DNP web site for detailed information.** There will be an open discussion of town meeting results at Hawaii 2014 on Wednesday afternoon, 8 October.

**Deadline**: Abstracts for the 2015 April Meeting (APR15) next April must be submitted by 5:00 p.m. EDT on Friday, January 9th. The sorters meeting to arrange the sessions will be the following Friday.

Note: APS members are entitled to one contributed abstract for oral presentation. A second abstract by the same lead speaker will be ignored.

Before beginning the abstract submission process, it is helpful to know (1) the number and ordering of the authors and (2) the content of the abstract. The web page will guide one through the submission process. Contributed abstracts are limited to 1300 characters.

Invited speakers should refer to their letters of invitation for instructions on locating the invited abstract submission web site. Invited abstracts are limited to 2000 characters.

You may have noticed the significant increase in the Impact Factor of "Physical Review C" over the past several years. That is the result of authors' enhanced referencing of their papers, "giving credit where credit is due." For that we thank you, the authors, not because the impact factor of the journal has increased but because your colleagues are gaining a larger number of citations which impacts hiring and promotions.
