5. NOMINATIONS FOR APS FELLOWSHIP

The procedure for the election of a Member to Fellowship is outlined in the Membership Directory of the APS under "Constitution and Bylaws," or can be found under Fellowships on the APS Home Page. Only web nominations are accepted. The total number of members who may be elected to Fellowship in a given year is one half of one percent of the total APS membership.

The DNP deadline is 1 May. Nomination instructions can be found on the APS home page (http://www.aps.org); link to "Fellowships" under the heading "Programs".

The 2016 DNP Fellowship Committee is comprised of A. Aprahamian (Chair), G. A. Miller, J. A. Cizewski, J. Nico, and A. Deshpande. The Fellowship Committee reviews the nominations for APS Fellowship referred to the DNP and recommends a slate of candidates, which is forwarded to the APS Fellowship Committee and then to the APS Council for approval. Nominations remain active for two years.

It is important for nominators to ensure that the cases that they prepare for the Fellowship Committee are well documented. In addition to that requested on the nomination form, information such as lists of invited talks, awards, professional activities, committee service, and participation in organization of conferences is very helpful. Inclusion of a complete publication list is highly recommended.

The DNP has adopted the following Fellowship Criteria Guidelines. To be chosen as a Fellow, an APS member should have a record of excellence in research that has been sustained over several years, and have completed at least one major, original work that has influenced his/her specialty in a significant way. The APS requires membership for at least the prior year.

The list of APS Fellows elected in a given year appears on the APS Home Page in December and is published in the March issue of APS News. The names of newly elected DNP Fellows are published in the February Newsletter and the awards are presented at the DNP Business Meeting held during the APS April Meeting.

7. DNP APRIL 2016 MEETING PROGRAM

The DNP Program Committee, under the leadership of Program Committee Chair Gordon Cates, has planned a full nuclear physics program for the APS April Meeting, 16-19 April 2016. In addition, there will be general plenary sessions each day except Sunday. The Kavili Keynote session with Nobel Prize winners A. McDonald and T. Kajita will be of particular interest to DNP members. The on-line BAPS program will be available for viewing in February.

Joint sessions have been arranged with the Committee on the Status of Women in Physics, the Division of the Physics of Beams, the Division of Astrophysics, the Division of Particles and Fields, the Division of Computational Physics, and the Topical Group on Few-Body Physics.

DNP stand alone sessions will include the DNP Prize Session with winners of the Bonner Prize and the Feshbach Prize plus a talk by R.G.H. Robertson and the following topic sessions:

 Direct and Surrogate Nuclear Reactions for Applications and Basic Research (organized by J. Dilling, C. Hoffman, and A. Spyrou), 2) New Results on the Spin Structure of the Nucleon (organized by X. Zheng),
 Low-Energy Neutrino-Nuclear Interactions (organized by R. Henning, D. Radford, and J. Wilkerson), and 4) Baryon Resonancs and the Evolution of the Early Universe (organized by V. Burkert and R. Fatemi).

Contributed abstracts for the DNP component of the meeting were arranged into coherent sessions by sorters Ben Gibson, Reyco Henning, Tanja Horn, and Marguerite Tonjes, under the direction of Program Committee Chair Gordon Cates and Vice Chair Michael Thoennessen.

9. DNP 2016 FALL MEETING IN VANCOUVER, BRITISH COLUMBIA, 13-16 OCTOBER 2016, Jens Dilling

The Annual Fall Meeting of the Division of Nuclear Physics of the American Physical Society will be held in Vancouver, British Columbia, 13-16 October 2016. Note that the days of the meeting are Thursday-Sunday. Three associated topical workshops will be held on Thursday morning, 13 October. The plenary session will take place on Thursday afternoon, starting at 3:00 p.m. A reception will be held immediately following the plenary session. The parallel scientific sessions -- invited sessions, mini-symposia, and contributed paper sessions -- will be held Friday and Saturday morning and afternoon as well as Sunday morning. The format will follow that of the Oakland meeting, with two 108 minute sessions in the morning, a long lunch break, and two 108 minute sessions in the afternoon. The CEU poster session and Physical Review Meet-the-Editors Drop-in will be scheduled in the early time slot on Friday afternoon. The Business/Town Meeting will be Friday afternoon in the late time slot, prior to the reception and banquet.

Venue and Host Institution: The meeting will be held in the Sheraton Hotel, Wall Centre Vancouver in the heart of downtown. All meeting functions will be held in the Sheraton Hotel. Vancouver is a clean, safe, and vibrant city which hosted the 2010 Winter Olympics. The host institution for the meeting is TRIUMF (National Laboratory). The Chair of the Local Organizing Committee will be Jens Dilling, ALD TRIUMF. Complete Conference Corrdinators, Inc. will serve as the conference coordinator, handling registration and hotel reservations.

Transportation: Vancouver is served by a major international airport (YVR) with many connections to the U.S. There is a direct sky train linking the airport with downtown Vancouver (~20 minutes trip). Vancouver has excellent public transportation throughout the city.

PASSPORT/VISA: With the meeting held in Vancouver, CANADA, there is a need to ask interested participants to obtain a valid passport for travel. In addition, for some foreign nationals it is necessary to inquire about a re-entry (or multi entry) visa to return to the U.S. TRIUMF has hosted many international conferences and workshops, including meetings in connection with the APS. If you are traveling from outside Canada, you may need a visa to enter Canada. Please refer to the Government of Canada site (http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/visas.asp) for instructions on how and who needs to apply for a Visitor's Visa to come to Canada.

US citizens carrying a valid US Passport do not require a Visa to come to Canada. Residents of the US who carry a passport from a country listed on the Government of Canada site will need an Invitation Letter from the Conference Chair to attach to their Visitor's Visa Application. Students studying abroad and who are planning to attend and are from a visa-required country will need to apply for a Visitor's Visa. Please allow sufficient time for processing. See: http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/information/applications/index.asp for an estimate of processing times.

As of March 15, 2016 any delegates from visa-exempt countries (excluding the U.S.) will need to apply for an eTA. The eTA costs CA\$7.00 and allows for pre-screening of visa exempt nationals. Please see the link for details related to the eTA: http://www.cic.gc.ca/english/visit/eta.asp.
